Policy to terminate Poverty

FMIPH cares about doing its part in the fight against poverty in order to leave a better world for future generations. In line with the goal of reducing at least half the proportion of women, men and children of all ages living in poverty, according to national definitions, by 2030, FMIPH's anti-poverty policy covers the following:

- It coordinates and carries out the scholarship/loan transactions given by various institutions, foundations, associations and companies to students who need basic services in order to continue their education.
- It provides basic services (health, accommodation, nutrition, psychological counseling) and on-campus transportation services to low-income students.
- It provides the opportunity to work part-time in order to support poor students economically during the education period.
- At the request of the local people, it provides vocational training in related fields and seminars that support personal development within the scope of lifelong learning. In line with sustainable development objectives, within the scope of entrepreneurship, it provides necessary training for both FMIPH graduates and local people to establish businesses, and develops and implements projects to provide various grant supports from the institutional stage.
- In order to end poverty, individuals, institutions, organizations, businesses, non-governmental organizations etc. on a local, regional, national and

- In addition to improving human skills and knowledge as a part of formal education, it contributes to economic development by creating capital and capacity development with practices such as research, R&D and consultancy.
- It aims to act jointly with regional stakeholders and create policies in the fight against poverty.

FMIPH carries out different studies to effectively reduce poverty in all its dimensions today, where many people are fighting to meet their most basic human needs. These activities are the realization of activities, trainings and projects that contribute to social, cultural and economic development that support the society in different dimensions in the fight against poverty, as well as in-kind and cash supports related to meeting the basic needs of students with low income levels.
